Passive (1) (is done /was done) very important in writing papers.

(Study this example)

This house was **built** in 1935.

Was built is passive.

@ Compare active and passive:

Somebody **built this house**

in 1935. (active)

This house subject

was built in 1935. (passive)

- ➤ When we use active verb, we say **what the subject does**:
- ♣ My grandfather was a builder. **He built** this house in 1935.
- **↓** It's a big company. **It employs** two hundred people.
- ➤ When we use a passive verb, we say *what happens to be the subject:*
- 4 This house is quite old. It was built in 1935.
- **Two hundred people are employed** by the company.
- ➤ When we use the passive, who or what causes the action is often unknown or unimportant:
- ♣ A lot of money **was stolen** in the robbery. (somebody stole it, but we don't know who)
- ♣ Is this room cleaned every day? (does somebody clean it? it's not important who)
- ➤ If we want to say who does or what causes the action, we use by...:
- This house was built by my grandfather.
- Two hundred people are employed by the company.

The passive is **be** (is/was etc.) + past participle (**done/cleaned/seen etc.**): (**be**) **done** (**be**) **cleaned** (**be**) **damaged** (**be**) **built** (**be**) **seen etc...**

(Study irregular verbs past participles very important)

> Study the active and passive forms of the *present simple and past simple:*

Passive (2) (be done / been done / being done)

Study the following active and passive forms:

(A): Infinitive

Active: (to) do/clean/see etc. Somebody will clean the room later.

Passive: (to) **be + done/cleaned/seen**. **The room will be cleaned** later.

Eeg:

4 A new supermarket is going to be built next year.

Please go away. I want to be left alone.

(B): Perfect infinitive

Active: (to) **have + done/cleaned/seen** etc. Somebody **should have cleaned the room**.

Passive: (to) have been + done/cleaned/seen etc. <u>The room</u> should have been cleaned.

Exg:

- **↓** I haven't received the letter yet. It might **have been sent** to the wrong address.
- There were some problems at first, but they seem to have been solved.

(C): Present perfect

Active: **have/has + done** etc. The room looks nice. Somebody **has cleaned** <u>it</u>.

Passive: have/has been + done etc. The room looks nice. It has been cleaned.

Exg:

- Have you ever been bitten by a dog?
- ♣ Are you going to the party?' 'No, I haven't been invited.'

(D): Past perfect

Active: **had + done** etc. The room looked nice. Somebody **had cleaned** *it*.

Passive: **had been + done** etc. The room looked nice. **t** had been cleaned. **Exg**:

- lacktriangle The vegetables didn't taste very good. They lacktriangle lacktriangle too long.
- ♣ The car was three years old but hadn't been used very much.

(E) Present continuous

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Active: **am/is/are + (do)ing** Somebody **is cleaning the room** at the moment.

Passive: **am/is/are + being (done) The room is being cleaned** at the moment.

Exg:

- **♣** There's somebody walking behind us. I think we **are being followed.**
- 4 (in a shop) 'Can I help you?' 'No, thank you. I'm being served.'

(F) Past continuous

Active: was/were + (do)ing Somebody was cleaning the room when I arrived.

Passive: was/were +being (done) The room was being cleaned when I arrived.

Exg:

4 There's somebody walking behind us. We were being followed.
