شرح زمن المضارع التام في اللغة الإنجليزية Present Perfect Tense

لعل زمن المضارع التام أكثر الأزمنة التي يستصعب منها الطلاب أثناء الدراسة والمعلمون أثناء الشرح. ويعود السبب في ذلك كونه غير موجود في اللغة العربي. ففي اللغة العربية لا يوجد أزمنة تامة.

المضارع التام البسيط Present Perfect Simple

تعريفه: هو ذلك الفعل الذي نستخدمه للتعبير عن حدث ماضي في فترة غير محددة في الزمن الماضي. حيث لا يزال أثر هذا الحدث قائم.

مثال: عندما استيقظنا من النوم هذا الصباح وجدنا أن الأرض مبتلة.

فنقول: It has rained . بمعنى أنها أمطرت.

لاحظ أن حدث المطر منتهي لكن الأثر ما زال قائم حتى هذه اللحظة وهو رطوبة الارض. وأيضا زمن هذا الحدث غير محدد. صحيح بأن الحدث تم اثناء فترة الليل لكن الفترة غير محددة.

Phrasal verbs

A phrasal verb is multi-word verb. It can be intransitive and transitive verb consisting of a verb plus a particle, as exemplified in:

Examples of intransitive phrasal verbs (without object)

Drink up quickly.

He is *playing around*.

When will they give in?

Can a particle be separated from its verb?

No, it can't.

It is wrong to say:

Drink quickly up.

Examples of Transitive Phrasal Verbs (with object)

Drink up your milk quickly.

He can't live down his past.

He looked up his former friends.

Phrasal verbs do not preserve the individual meaning of verb and particle. In other words, the meaning of combination cannot be predicted from the meanings of verb and particle in isolation. Ex. give in (surrender)

catch on (understand)

turn up (appear)

Moreover, the new meaning, is produced from the combination of verb plus particle especially the particle. The phrasal verb *talk down (speak*

negatively about someone) receives its new meaning from the particle down.

Exercise:

The sentence (He turned on the lights.) can be written and spoken with phrasal verb (turned on) and with the verb in isolation (turn).
